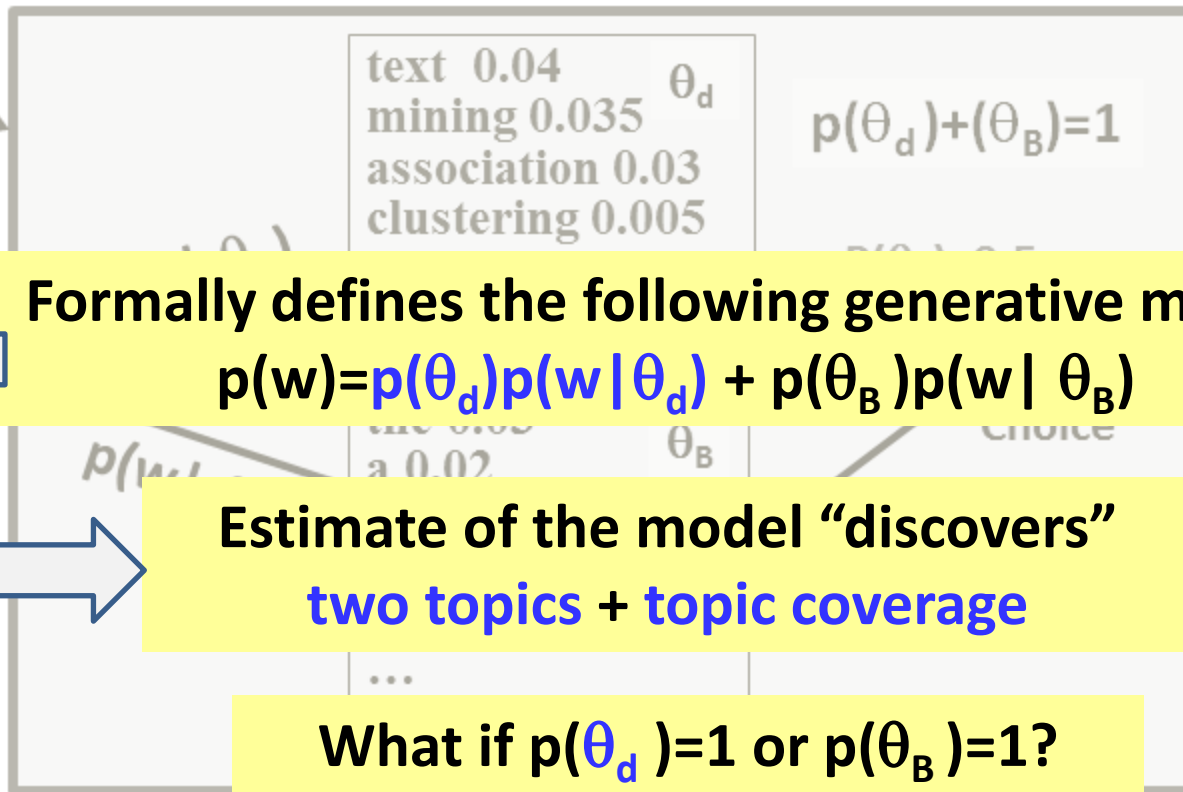


As a Generative Model...
