

Typical Structure of a Research Paper

- 1. Introduction
 - Background discussion to motivate your problem
 - Define your problem
 - Argue why it's important to solve the problem
 - Identify knowledge gap in existing work or point out deficiency of existing answers/solutions
 - Summarize your contributions
 - Briefly mention potential impact
- Tips:
 - Start with sentences understandable to almost everyone
 - Tell the story at a high-level so that the entire introduction is understandable to people with no/little technical background in the topic
 - Use examples if possible
