After You Get Reviews Back

- Carefully classify comments into:
 - Unreasonable comments (e.g., misunderstanding):
 - Try to improve the clarity of your writing
 - Reasonable comments
 - Constructive: easy to implement
 - Non-constructive: think about it, either argue the other way or mention weakness of your work in the paper
- If paper is accepted
 - Take the last chance to polish the paper as much as you can
 - You'll regret if later you discover an inaccurate statement or a typo in your published paper
- If paper is rejected
 - Digest comments and try to improve the research work and the paper
 - Run more experiments if necessary
 - Don't try to please reviewers (the next reviewer might say something opposite); instead use your own
 judgments and use their comments to help improve your judgments
 - Reposition the paper if necessary (again, don't reposition it just because a reviewer rejected your original positioning)
